

## LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Fellow Conservatives,

I am pleased to present the American Conservative Union Foundation's ratings for the 2015 meeting of the Pennsylvania General Assembly. Like our Congressional Ratings, our State Ratings reflect how elected officials view the role of government in an individual's life. The Pennsylvania legislators with the strongest scores voted most consistently with the ideals articulated in the US Constitution: limited and transparent government, individual rights, personal responsibility, and a healthy culture.

The 2014 election completed a political transformation that began in 2010 and resulted in voters of almost half the states, 23 in all, entrusting Republicans with the governorships as well as control of both chambers in the respective state, the biggest sweep since the first half of the 20th Century.

By examining all our State Ratings (which cover a wide variety of issues) we can see which states have best used their Republican majorities to apply conservative principles, how others have struggled, and in yet other states, how conservatives have stood up against liberal majorities. I know that this guide will provide you with the most comprehensive evaluative tool to learn how your legislators measure up.

ACU researched and selected a range of bills before the Pennsylvania General Assembly that determine a member's adherence to conservative principles. We selected bills that focus on Ronald Reagan's philosophy of the "three-legged stool": 1) *fiscal and economic*: taxes, budgets, regulation, spending, healthcare, and property; 2) *social and cultural*: 2nd amendment, religion, life, welfare, and education; and 3) *government integrity*: voting, individual liberty, privacy, and transparency. This wide range of issues are designed to give citizens an accurate assessment that conveys which of Pennsylvania's elected leaders best defend the principles of a free society: Life, Liberty and Property.

## PENNSYLVANIA SENATE VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

1. **SB 9 Welfare Reform.** This bill requires those who seek public assistance to provide proof that they are a U.S. citizen, a legal permanent resident or is lawfully present in the United States under federal law. ACU opposes special benefits for illegal immigrants and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on February 24, 2015 by a vote of 40-8.

---

2. **SB 333 Mandated Paid Leave.** This bill prohibits localities from mandating that all businesses offer employees paid leave. ACU opposes government interference in employee contracts and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on April 14, 2015 by a vote of 37-12.

---

3. **SB 644 Collective Bargaining Agreement Accountability.** This bill requires a cost analysis of collective bargaining agreements under the Governor's jurisdiction be made available before the agreement is executed. ACU supports increased government accountability to the taxpayer who pays for these agreements and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on May 6, 2015 by a vote of 29-19.

---

4. **SB 1 State Employee Pension Reform.** This bill establishes a defined contribution pension system for most new state employees. ACU supports pension reform that will keep the system solvent and save taxpayers \$18 billion over the next 30 years and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on May 13, 2015 by a vote of 28-19 but it was vetoed by the Governor.

---

5. **Executive Nominations.** This Senate voted confirms the nomination of Pedro Cortés as Secretary of the Commonwealth. ACU opposed the nominee who, as Secretary of the Commonwealth in the previous Rendell Administration, ignored numerous complaints made against abortionist Kermit Gosnell, who was later convicted of killing babies born alive. The Senate voted to confirm Cortés on June 2, 2015 by a vote of 31-18.

---

6. **SB 490 Gubernatorial Appointments.** This bill requires State Senate confirmation of the Director of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Authority, now under the Governor's sole authority. ACU supports a check and balance system for executive appointments and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 2, 2015 by a vote of 32-17.

---

7. **SB 6 Charter Schools.** This bill allows for the expansion of charter schools by allowing an achievement school district (designated underperforming schools) to convert a school under its jurisdiction to a charter school. ACU supports the expansion of school choice and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 28, 2015 by a vote of 27-22.

---

8. **HB 466 Liquor Store Privatization.** This bill eliminates the government monopoly over the sale of liquor in stores and creates a licensing system to be sold through an auction system. ACU opposes government-run monopolies over the sale of legal products and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 30, 2015 by a vote of 27-22 but it was vetoed by the Governor.

---

9. **SB 655 Energy Production Regulations.** This bill implements the Fiscal Years 2015 and 2016 budget and includes a provision that prevents the state Environmental Quality Board from revising existing rulemaking or regulations on the operation of conventional oil and gas wells. ACU opposes government agencies changing rules without legislative approval and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 30, 2015 by a vote of 30-19.

---

10. **HB 224 Government Transparency.** This bill requires the Department of Education to improve access to financial data on the Internet, including annual financial statement and adopted budgets of school districts. ACU supports government transparency and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on September 18, 2015 by a vote of 30-19.

---

11. **SB 501 Paycheck Protection.** This bill ends the practice of the state and public school districts withholding union dues from employee paychecks. ACU opposes having the government act as a collection agency for the unions and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on October 14, 2015 by a vote of 26-23.

---

12. **HB 874 Union Exemptions From Criminal Law.** This bill removes the exemptions by parties to a labor dispute from crimes such as harassment and stalking but makes it clear that constitutionally protected activity is allowed. ACU opposes these special exemptions and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on October 20, 2015 by a vote of 30-18.

---

13. **SB 1073 Budget Bill.** This bill increases spending by 6 percent despite revenue projections much lower than that, requiring tax increases to balance the budget forward. ACU opposed this bill as fiscally irresponsible. The Senate passed the bill on December 7, 2015 by a vote of 43-7.

## PENNSYLVANIA HOUSE VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

1. **HB 466 Liquor Store Privatization.** This bill eliminates the government monopoly over the sale of liquor in stores and creates a licensing system to be sold through an auction system. ACU opposes government-run monopolies over the sale of legal products and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on February 26, 2015 by a vote of 114-87 but it was vetoed by the Governor.

---

2. **HB 874 Union Exemptions From Criminal Law.** This bill removes a party's exemption from labor disputes for crimes, such as harassment and stalking, but makes it clear that constitutionally protected activity is allowed. ACU opposes these special exemptions and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on April 21, 2015 by a vote of 109-84.

---

3. **HB 516 Naturopathic Physician License.** This bill requires that the State Board of Medicine set up a licensing system for naturopathic physicians, those who use non-prescription medication and natural healing to treat disease. ACU opposes the proliferation of licenses for occupations that are primarily designed to restrict competition and opposed this bill. The House passed the bill on April 22, 2015 by a vote of 169-25.

---

4. **HB 504 Amendment 1559 Comprehensive Tax Legislation.** This bill substantially increases both sales and income taxes in order to reduce property taxes. Although property tax relief is always welcome, ACU opposes paying for it with anti-growth tax increases that would hit small businesses involved in leasing property particularly hard and opposed this bill. A key vote came on the Knowles amendment to put the tax plan up for approval by a voter referendum and ACU supported this amendment. The House defeated the amendment on May 12, 2015 by a vote of 58-135.

---

5. **HB 210 School Construction Reform.** This bill increases government transparency by requiring the Pennsylvania Department of Education to provide an electronic database for public school construction projects. The bill also strengthens local control by eliminating any requirement that a school district seek Commonwealth approval for a construction project if they are not seeking reimbursement. ACU supports these reforms that strengthen accountability and local control and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on May 12, 2015 by a vote of 142-52.

---

6. **HB 805 Teacher Evaluations.** This bill replaces a seniority system for deciding who will be furloughed or reinstated, known as the "last in, first out" policy, and replace it with a system of performance evaluations. ACU supports a merit system for teachers and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on June 23, 2015 by a vote of 100-91.

---

7. **HB 810 Loan Guarantees for Favored Businesses.** This bill expands a government loan guarantee program for businesses the government favors, such as life sciences, advanced technology and manufacturing. The bill removes a requirement that the business be no more than seven years old and that the guarantee not exceed a certain percentage of the principal amount. ACU opposes an expansion of a program that puts taxpayer money at risk and favors one business over another and opposed this bill. The House passed the bill on June 24, 2015 by a vote of 130-64.

---

8. **HB 1196 Powdered Alcohol.** This bill makes it illegal to possess, purchase, sell or use powdered alcohol. ACU opposes a bill primarily designed to restrict competition and prohibits a product deemed safe by the FDA from entering the market and opposed this bill. The House passed the bill on June 25, 2015 by a vote of 169-22.

---

9. **SB 655 Energy Production Regulations.** This bill implements the Fiscal Years 2015 and 2016 budget and includes a provision that prevents the state Environmental Quality Board from revising existing rulemaking or regulations on the operation of conventional oil and gas wells. ACU opposes government agencies changing rules without legislative approval and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on June 29, 2015 by a vote of 107-87.

---

10. **SB 1 State Employee Pension Reform.** This bill establishes a defined contribution pension system for most new state employees. ACU supports pension reform that will keep the system solvent and save taxpayers \$18 billion over the next 30 years and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on June 30, 2015 by a vote of 106-89 but it was vetoed by the Governor.

---

11. **HB 471 Repealing Ethanol Mandates.** This bill repeals Pennsylvania's ethanol blending mandate and removes the cellulosic ethanol content requirement in gasoline. ACU believes that all forms of energy should compete within the free market and that government should refrain from helping favored energy sources and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on September 21, 2015 by a vote of 155-42.

---

12. **HB 224 Government Transparency.** This bill requires the Department of Education to improve access to financial data on the Internet, including annual financial statement and adopted budgets of school districts. ACU supports government transparency and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on September 24, 2015 by a vote of 112-87.



13. **HB 950 Red Light Cameras.** This bill makes permanent Pennsylvania's pilot program for red light cameras. ACU opposes these programs that are designed to raise revenue rather than improve traffic safety and opposed this bill. The House passed the bill on October 20, 2015 by a vote of 179-18.
- 
14. **HB 928 Reducing the State's Debt.** This bill lowers the state's Redevelopment Assistance Capital Projects debt limit by \$50 million over ten years. ACU supports this fiscally sound approach that will prevent the state from accumulating an unsustainable debt and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on October 21, 2015 by a vote of 121-76.
- 
15. **SB 490 Gubernatorial Appointments.** This bill requires that the State Senate confirms the appointment of the Director of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Authority, an action now under the sole authority of the Governor. ACU supports a check and balance system for executive appointments and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on November 18, 2015 by a vote of 117-82.
- 
16. **HB 1618 State Inspector General.** This bill creates the office of an independent State Inspector General to conduct investigations and provide oversight to prevent waste, fraud and abuse in state agencies. Under the bill, the IG is appointed by the Governor for a six year term and must be confirmed by two-thirds of the State Senate. ACU supports strong oversight of how taxpayers' funds are spent and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on November 24, 2015 by a vote of 115-82.
- 
17. **SB 1073 Budget Bill.** This bill increases spending by 6% despite revenue projections much lower than that, requiring tax increases to balance the budget. A key vote came on a motion for "second consideration," allowing the bill to move forward. ACU opposed this bill as fiscally irresponsible and opposed this motion. The House approved the motion on December 22, 2015 by a vote of 100-97.
