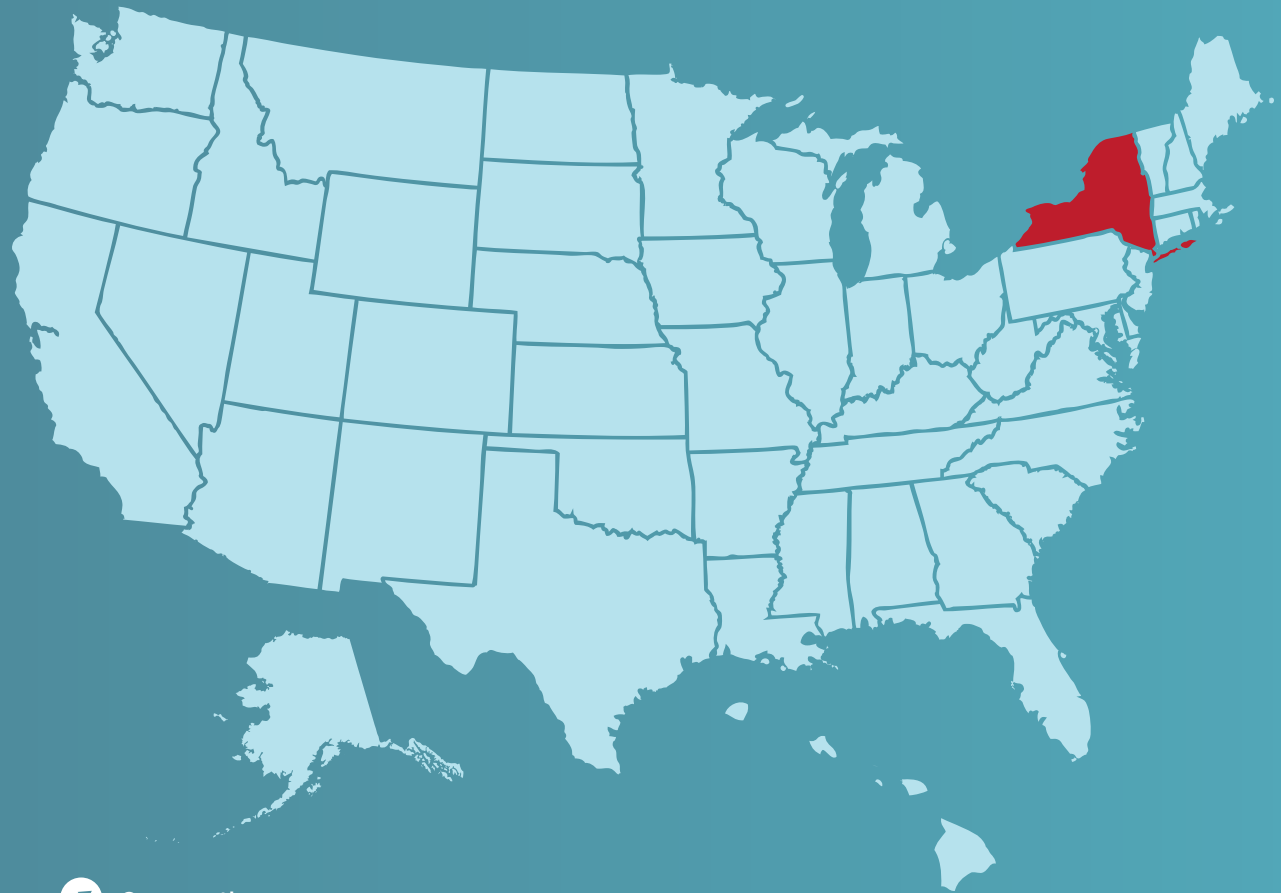
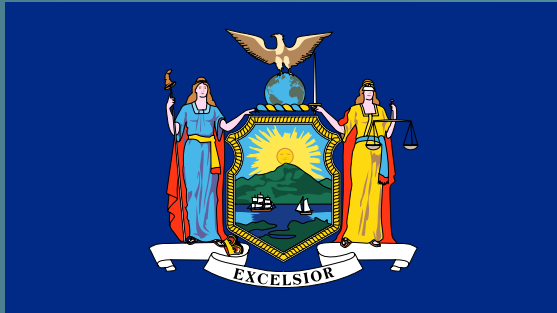

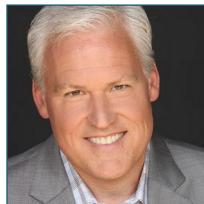

SELECTING THE VOTES

ACU researched and selected a range of bills before the New York State Legislature that determine a member's adherence to conservative principles. We selected bills that focus on Ronald Reagan's philosophy of the "three-legged stool": 1) *fiscal and economic*: taxes, budgets, regulation, spending, healthcare, and property; 2) *social and cultural*: 2nd amendment, religion, life, welfare, and education; and 3) *government integrity*: voting, individual liberty, privacy, and transparency. This wide range of issues are designed to give citizens an accurate assessment that conveys which of New York's elected leaders best defend the principles of a free society: Life, Liberty and Property.

NEW YORK SENATE VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

1. **S 5507 Spending Cap.** This bill establishes an annual spending cap and limits spending increases to a three-year rolling average based on inflation. The bill also directs the governor to take corrective action should the state comptroller find that spending has exceeded the cap. ACU supports maintaining fiscal discipline through spending caps and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on January 12, 2016 by a vote of 39-22.

2. **S 5949A Legalizing Mixed Martial Arts.** This bill makes New York the last state in the country to legalize mixed martial arts by setting up protocols and licensing procedures. ACU supports expanding personal liberty and legalizing a sport that is allowed in every other state and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on February 1, 2016 by a vote of 48-14.

3. **S 6406 Minimum Wage and Competitive Bidding.** This omnibus bill increases the New York City minimum wage to \$15 an hour by 2020 and the statewide minimum wage to the same level by 2022. The bill also eliminates the lowest bidder requirement for contracts under \$100,000 and eliminates competitive bidding for contracts to women-owned and minority-owned businesses for contracts up to \$400,000. An increase in the minimum wage results in higher unemployment, and high rates of unemployment hinder family prosperity, as illustrated by the ACU Foundation's Family Prosperity Index. ACU opposes artificial wages that hurt those who need help with employment the most, such as students and inexperienced workers, supports competitive bidding whenever possible, and opposed this bill. The Senate passed the bill on March 31, 2016 by a vote of 61-1.

4. **S 5013 Subsidies for "Green Home Development."** This bill creates a 35 percent real property tax exemption (subject to adoption by local municipalities) for homes approved by the government. The criteria established under the bill includes the use of Energy Star rated appliances, renewable energy sources, and recycled content, among other standards. ACU supports all forms of energy, believes government should not favor one form of energy over another, and opposed this bill. The Senate passed the bill on May 23, 2016 by a vote of 58-1.

5. **S 3019 Reducing Medicaid Fraud.** This bill increases the incentive for municipalities to investigate and prosecute Medicaid fraud. Under the bill, local governments would be reimbursed for any overpayment and small local governments would be guaranteed 10 percent of any recovery of funds. ACU supports efforts to reduce the massive fraud found in the Medicaid program nationwide and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 2, 2016 by a vote of 58-1.

6. **S 2295 Unfunded Mandates.** This bill requires any state-mandated program that is imposed on local governments and school districts to be funded by the state. ACU opposes unfunded mandates and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 6, 2016 by a vote of 49-12.

7. **S 7336 Bag Tax.** This bill prohibits local governments from imposing a tax or fee on "carry out" merchandise bags. ACU believes the government should not limit people's choices in how they transport their groceries or shopping items home and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 7, 2016 by a vote of 35-24.

8. **S 5131 "Reforming Energy Vision" Oversight.** This bill requires the Public Service Commission to conduct a cost-benefit analysis of the "Reforming Energy Vision Initiative." The bill also prevents any new taxes or fees from being implemented until the analysis is completed. ACU supports cost-benefit analyses of existing programs and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 9, 2016 by a vote of 33-28.

9. **S 5636 Farm Subsidies.** This bill provides \$25,000 for farms of 150 acres or less for infrastructure, equipment modernization, and farm product marketing. ACU opposes the practice of providing subsidies to private industry, especially in this case when farmers already receive federal subsidies for crop insurance and price supports, and opposed this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 9, 2016 by a vote of 60-1.

10. **A 446 Birth Center Regulations.** This bill gives the Commissioner of Health more flexibility when approving freestanding birth centers by allowing the Commissioner to adjust the state's certificate of need requirements. ACU opposes certificate of need regulations, which are primarily designed to restrict competition, and supported this bill as a step in the right direction. The Senate passed the bill on June 14, 2016 by a vote of 57-4.

11. **A 9925 Geothermal Energy Subsidies.** This bill provides a 25 percent tax credit for the cost of purchasing and installing geothermal energy systems. ACU supports all forms of energy, believes the government should not favor one form of energy over another, and opposed this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 62-0.

12. **A 9042 Knife Regulations.** This bill clearly defines the difference between a switchblade knife and a gravity knife. Due to the previous vague definition of knives, thousands of individuals have been prosecuted, even though they had no criminal intent and were unaware they were carrying unlawfully. ACU supports reforming vague laws to expand personal freedom, especially regarding issues relating to personal protection, and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 61-1.

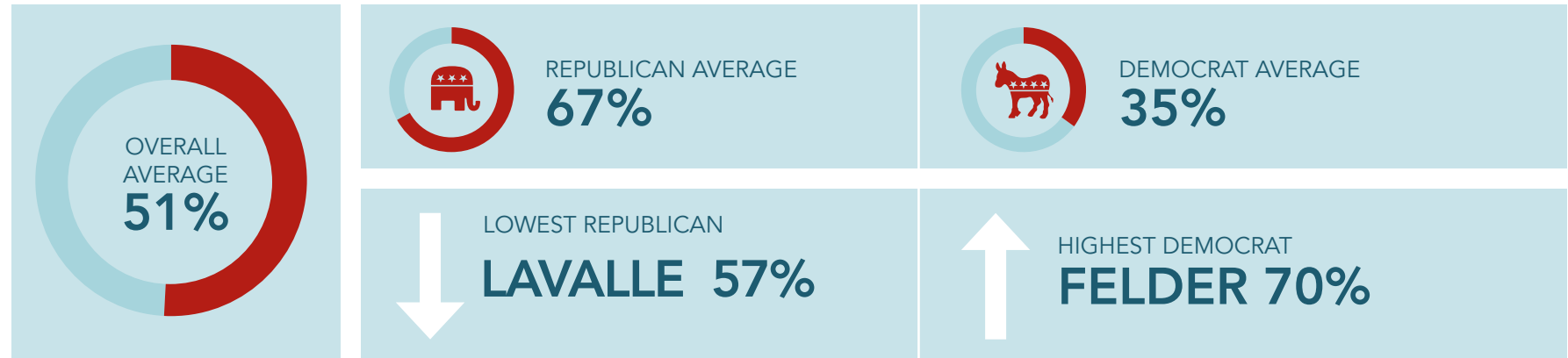

13. **S 7826 State Building Codes.** This bill prevents local governments from mandating compliance with new building codes before the state has had the opportunity to review and approve the new codes, as required by law. Currently, some homeowners have been forced by local governments to abide by costly regulations, only to have the codes ultimately turned down by the state. ACU opposes attempts by local government to circumvent the law and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 40-22.

14. **S 7573 Tuition Subsidies.** This bill raises the income eligibility for tuition subsidies to those making up to \$100,000 per year. The minimum payout is also doubled from \$500 to \$1,000 per year. ACU opposes this subsidy expansion, which is essentially a wealth transfer payment to those who will be the highest earners in the future. The subsidy is expected to cost taxpayers an additional \$87.4 million a year and raises the overall cost of higher education, and ACU opposed this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 61-1.

15. **S 6954 Housing Subsidies.** This bill gives \$100,000 grants to activist organizations (like ACORN) and local governments to replace dilapidated mobile homes occupied by those whose income is 20 percent below the area's median income. The bill also entitles program administrators to an "administrative fee" of 7.5 percent for their services. Furthermore, the bill pays for the relocation costs incurred by the homeowner while construction is underway. The only major requirement for the homeowner under the program is they must reside in the new home for at least 10 years. ACU opposes government programs that fund activist organizations and uses arbitrary eligibility standards for government assistance and opposed this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 62-0.

16. **S 6724 Government Oversight.** This bill requires the Public Service Commission to obtain approval from the Public Authorities Council Board (PACB), which includes members of the legislature, for any action that increases costs for ratepayers by more than \$700,000. The bill also requires the state Energy Research and Development Authority to get approval from the PACB when repurposing funds for a different use. ACU supports increased oversight of government programs and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 32-29.

17. **S 6713 Welfare Reform.** This bill prohibits public assistance benefits from being used to purchase tobacco, alcoholic beverages, or lottery tickets, among other restrictions. An overreliance on welfare diminishes recipients' employment prospects, keeping families out of the workforce and unable to prosper, as illustrated by the ACU Foundation's Family Prosperity Index. ACU supports reasonable restrictions on welfare benefits and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 53-9.
-
18. **S 1980 Child Labor Laws.** This bill provides for a religious exemption to the state's child labor laws to accommodate Amish work and religious practices. Under the bill, children between the ages of 14 and 17 can engage in some work activities under adult supervision. ACU supports regulatory reform that allows individuals to practice their religion and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 41-21.
-
19. **S 1853 Unemployment Insurance Regulations.** This bill exempts employers from paying unemployment insurance fees for workers who are ineligible for federal benefits. Currently, employers have to pay the fees for temporary workers from other countries even though they are ineligible for the benefits. ACU supports common sense regulatory reform and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 16, 2016 by a vote of 34-28.

20. **S 3624 Biodiesel Subsidies.** This bill gives matching taxpayer funds to farmers and companies for costs associated with the agricultural production of biodiesel fuel. ACU supports all forms of energy, believes government should not support one form of energy over another, and opposed this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 16, 2016 by a vote of 50-12.

21. **S 4242 Transport of Liquefied Natural Gas.** This bill allows for the transportation of Liquefied Natural Gas fuel throughout the state by eliminating some state environmental statutes. ACU supports this effort to allow for the sale of this competitive alternative to diesel fuel and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 16, 2016 by a vote of 33-29.
-
22. **S 6032 Sanctuary Cities.** This bill requires local governments to enforce federal and state immigration laws and requires them to assist and cooperate with federal officials. The bill withholds state funding from localities that do not cooperate. ACU supports the enforcement of federal immigration laws and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 17, 2016 by a vote of 36-26.

23. **A 10249 Charity Raffle Regulations.** This bill allows charities to accept credit and debit cards for raffle tickets and allows payments to be made over the Internet. ACU supports common sense regulatory reform and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 17, 2016 by a vote of 59-3.

NEW YORK ASSEMBLY VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

1. **A 2063 Grants to Microenterprises.** This bill provides grants of up to \$5,000 to microenterprise organizations and entrepreneurs that are chosen by the government based on the businesses' size and income levels. ACU opposes the government use of taxpayer funds to compete with venture capital providers and banks in the private sector and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on February 9, 2016 by a vote of 136-4.
2. **S 5949A Legalizing Mixed Martial Arts.** This bill makes New York the last state in the country to legalize mixed martial arts by setting up protocols and licensing procedures. ACU supports expanding personal liberty and legalizing a sport that is allowed in every other state and supported this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on March 22, 2016 by a vote of 114-26.
3. **A 39 Tire Repair Regulations.** This bill prohibits motor vehicle repair shops from repairing a tire that would not pass a state inspection. ACU opposes nanny state laws and believes an individual should be able to repair whichever tire he or she wants to repair and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on March 30, 2016 by a vote of 127-15.
4. **A 277 Business Mandate.** This bill forces businesses to allow anyone with certain medical conditions, such as Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis, to use restrooms that are reserved for employees only. ACU opposes mandates dictating how businesses use their bathrooms, which invites lawsuits, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on March 31, 2016 by a vote of 135-8.
5. **S 6406 Minimum Wage and Competitive Bidding.** This omnibus bill increases the New York City minimum wage to \$15 an hour by 2020 and the statewide minimum wage to the same level by 2022. The bill also eliminates the lowest bidder requirement for contracts under \$100,000 and eliminates competitive bidding for contracts to women-owned and minority-owned businesses for contracts up to \$400,000. An increase in the minimum wage results in higher unemployment, and high rates of unemployment hinder family prosperity, as illustrated by the ACU Foundation's Family Prosperity Index. ACU opposes artificial wages that hurt those who need help with employment the most, such as students and inexperienced workers, supports competitive bidding whenever possible, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on April 1, 2016 by a vote of 104-39.
6. **A 103 Gasoline Price Controls.** This bill adds more regulations to the state's complex system of gasoline price controls. The bill specifically strengthens zone pricing controls, which prevent wholesalers from charging individual gasoline stations different prices. ACU opposes price controls, which reduce competition and lead to shortages and reduced product quality, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on April 4, 2016 by a vote of 117-11.
7. **A 6937 The Fair Pay Act.** This bill makes it unlawful to pay employees different wages on the basis of sex, race, or national origin. It also requires that employers provide the same level of compensation to all employees regardless of sex, race, or national origin as long as the employees have "equivalent" jobs. ACU opposes mandates which are primarily designed to encourage lawsuits, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on April 11, 2016 by a vote of 91-42.
8. **A 5844 Fluorescent Lightbulb Ban.** This bill bans the sale of most fluorescent lamps and bulbs that contain mercury. ACU believes that the government should not determine what types of lightbulbs are available to the public and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on May 4, 2016 by a vote of 127-7.
9. **A 5612 Toy Regulation.** This bill requires that toy manufacturers report to a state agency the use of certain chemicals the government has deemed "toxic" and pay a \$500 fee for using the chemicals. In addition, the bill prohibits selling any children's products from 2019 onward that contain one of the prohibited chemicals. ACU opposes this overly broad bill, which does not differentiate between added chemicals and ones that naturally occur in safe toys, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on May 4, 2016 by a vote of 111-24.
10. **A 4558 Increasing List of "Hate Crimes".** This bill adds "gender identity" to the list of offenses considered "hate crimes." ACU believes hate crime legislation violates the constitutional protection against double jeopardy, and believes people should be prosecuted only once for a particular crime, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on May 9, 2016 by a vote of 87-48.
11. **A 446 Birth Center Regulations.** This bill gives the Commissioner of Health more flexibility when approving freestanding birth centers by allowing the Commissioner to adjust the state's certificate of need requirements. ACU opposes certificate of need regulations, which are primarily designed to restrict competition, and supported this bill as a step in the right direction. The Assembly passed the bill on May 11, 2016 by a vote of 100-29.



12. **A 6269 Trailer Park Rent Control.** This bill allows trailer park residents to challenge a lot rent increase as “unjustifiable” if the increase is higher than the yearly rise in the consumer price index. The trailer park owner then must “prove” the increase is “justifiable.” ACU opposes price controls, which reduce the availability of housing and distort the marketplace, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on May 16, 2016 by a vote of 115-29.
13. **A 4780 Reducing Work Search Requirements for Unemployment Insurance.** This bill allows the state unemployment benefits commissioner to “take into account” a person’s child care needs when deciding whether work search requirements have been met for unemployment insurance. ACU opposes this effort to water down work search requirements through an arbitrary decision by the benefits commissioner and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on May 17, 2016 by a vote of 96-44.
14. **A 5414 Enforcing Prevailing Wage Laws.** This bill prevents any company that has failed to abide by federal prevailing wage laws under the Davis-Bacon Act from obtaining a contract from New York’s state government. ACU opposes the prevailing wage, which burdens taxpayers by setting wage rates above the market level and drives up the costs of public projects. ACU also opposes efforts designed to create extortion opportunities against employers and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on May 24, 2016 by a vote of 101-38.
15. **A 5062 Single Payer Health Care System.** This bill would establish a European-style, single-payer health care system in New York that would complete the government takeover of the health care system that began under Obamacare. ACU opposes socialized health care systems, which recently failed in the neighboring state of Vermont and have resulted in poor quality and month-long waiting periods in countries that currently implement them, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 1, 2016 by a vote of 86-53.
16. **A 10342 Renewable Energy Mandate.** This bill creates new standards for the state to cut greenhouse gas emissions. This includes reducing emission levels 25 percent below their 1990 levels by the year 2025 and up to 80 percent below 1990 levels by the year 2045. The state will also have to obtain 50 percent of its electricity from renewable energy sources by the year 2030. ACU supports all forms of energy, believes government should not favor one form of energy over another, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill by June 1, 2016 by a vote of 86-43.
17. **A 9042 Knife Regulations.** This bill clearly defines the difference between a switchblade knife and a gravity knife. Due to the previous vague definition of knives, thousands of individuals have been prosecuted, even though they had no criminal intent and were unaware they were carrying unlawfully. ACU supports reforming vague laws to expand personal freedom, especially regarding issues relating to personal protection, and supported this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 2, 2016 by a vote of 117-12.
18. **A 4311 Illegal Immigrant Benefits.** This bill provides scholarships and state higher education financial aid to illegal immigrants. ACU opposes special benefits to illegal immigrants, which are paid for by citizens and legal residents of the United States, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 6, 2016 by a vote of 89-49.
19. **A 10249 Charity Raffle Regulations.** This bill allows charities to accept credit and debit cards for raffle tickets and allows payments to be made over the Internet. ACU supports common sense regulatory reform and supported this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 6, 2016 by a vote of 136-8.
20. **A 6221 Codifying Abortion Law.** This bill codifies into New York State law the right of a woman to have an abortion within 24 weeks of conception. ACU Foundation’s Center for Human Dignity engages heavily on these issues, believes abortion is a human tragedy, supports restrictions on the practice and educating patients, and ACU opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 7, 2016 by a vote of 92-50.
21. **A 3809 Rent Control Mandate.** This bill prevents a landlord from raising the rent on a tenant at the expiration date of a lease. Under the bill, a landlord can only raise the rent on a property after a tenant vacates the unit. The bill also makes it unlawful to encourage a tenant to vacate by neglecting to provide reasonable housing maintenance accommodations. ACU Foundation’s Center for 21st Century Property Rights engages heavily on this issue, and opposes rent price controls, which reduce the quality and supply of housing, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 9, 2016 by a vote of 90-47.
22. **A 8580 Nursing Home Mandate.** This bill sets up a complex series of minimum staffing levels for acute care facilities and nursing homes. For example, facilities with trauma units would have to have a patient to staff ratio of 1:1 and rehab centers would require at least one staff member for every 5 patients. In addition, the bill provides for a private right of action for “whistleblowing” employees who believe the mandate has been violated. ACU opposes such arbitrary government mandates, which drive up the cost of nursing care and encourage expensive lawsuits. ACU also opposes efforts designed to create extortion opportunities against employers and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 14, 2016 by a vote of 108-32.
23. **A 9925 Geothermal Energy Subsidies.** This bill provides a 25 percent tax credit for the costs of purchasing and installing geothermal energy systems. ACU supports all forms of energy, believes the government should not favor one form of energy over another, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 14, 2016 by a vote of 136-1.



24. **A 10370 Online Voter Registration.** This bill allows an individual to register to vote online and specifically states that the failure to provide an electronic signature shall not prevent a person from registering. ACU opposes measures that weaken ballot integrity and make it easier to commit voter fraud and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 14, 2016 by a vote of 127-14.

25. **A 5955 E-Cigarettes.** This bill places the same restrictions on e-cigarettes that are imposed on regular cigarettes and bans them from public places. ACU believes that both tobacco and e-cigarettes are a personal liberty issue and that government regulations on products are only appropriate when their use substantially impacts others, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 93-47.

26. **A 6975 Campaign Finance Regulations.** This bill establishes a complex series of requirements for limited liability companies to follow when making campaign contributions. These requirements include disclosing the identity of all direct and indirect owners and a breakdown of the contributions based on each owner's membership interest in the company. ACU opposes such draconian regulations, which are primarily designed to infringe upon political speech, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 131-11.

27. **S 7216 Worker's Compensation Expansion.** This bill adds forest rangers to the list of workers who are automatically presumed to be eligible for worker's compensation for any heart disease related impairment. ACU believes worker's compensation should be reserved for those who can show their illness or injury is job-related and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 15, 2016 by a vote of 140-3.

28. **A 8487 State Contractor Mandate.** This bill requires state contractors to disclose their employees' compensation, broken down by race, gender, and any other information the state comptroller deems necessary, when a contractor is considering a bid. ACU opposes such employer mandates, which have no bearing on the ability of a company to complete the project, and are designed to create extortion opportunities against employers and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 16, 2016 by a vote of 125-15.

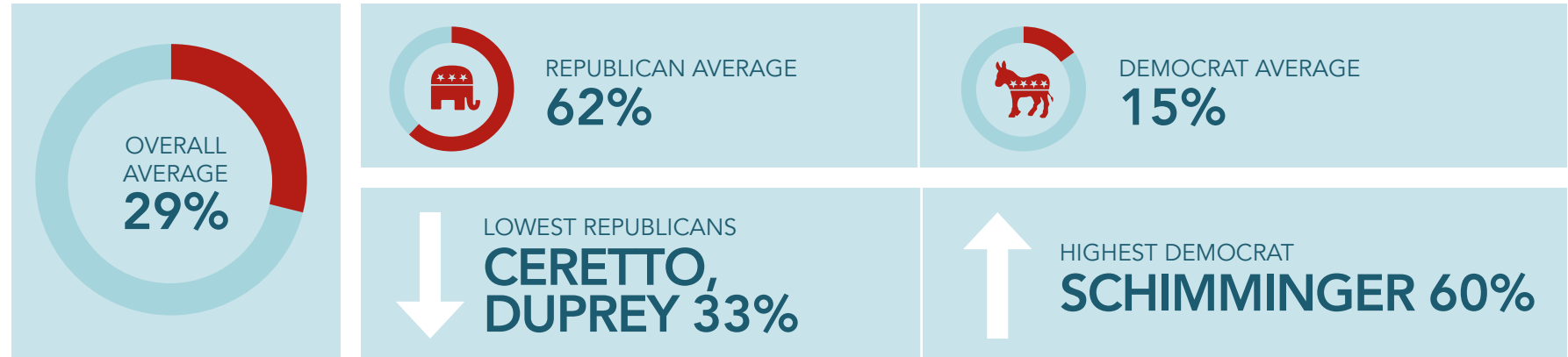
29. **A 10680 Paid Family Leave Mandate.** This bill extends the right to obtain paid family leave to construction workers, even if they work for multiple employers and were only employed for 26 out of the previous 39 weeks. ACU opposes such employer mandates, which drive up the cost of business, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 16, 2016 by a vote of 107-36.

30. **A 6376 Insurance Mandate.** This bill requires blanket health insurance policies to cover mental health outpatient treatment. Such treatments include marriage and family therapists and creative art therapists. ACU opposes such insurance mandates, which drive up the cost of healthcare for everyone, and opposed this bill. The Assembly passed the bill on June 17, 2016 by a vote of 123-13.
